







Big Picture Trends

- Population growing at a slowing rate births down, deaths up
- Migration and mobility slowing
 - Harder to attract and retaining the best and brightest.
- Concentrated growth in Front Range both jobs and people
- Aging impacts everything
 - Largest share of future growth is the 65+
 - Prime working age and youth becoming smaller share of total pop
- Growing race and ethnic diversity.









 - 19 states lost population








2010 to 2020 - 95% of population and job growth along Front Range

2020 to 2022 - Decreased to 75%, with a number of Denver Metro Counties losing population 2022 to future - Forecast to return more of a pre-COVID trend




Components of Colorado Population Change 1970-2022



Colorado growth slows from an annual average of 74K last decade to 26,000











Net Migration by Age








Net Migration by Age





 - Data is confounding











Jobs by Sector: Chaffee County, 2022



* Gov't Jobs include 600 jobs in the hospital district.




Base Jobs by Sector, 2022 Chaffee County



Remote and Hybrid Work:


- Not every industry
- Increases with higher earning industries.
- 11.1% Establishments with employees working remote all of the time.
- 72.5% Establishments with employees working remotely rarely

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
- 1.8% Establishments expect remote work to increase
- 3% Establishments expect remote work to decrease.

Percent distribution of private-sector establishments by telework arrangement and industry, July-September 2021, and August-September 2022










Supply


- Fewer units built last decade
- Slow industry to start and stop
- Financing
- Supply chain and tight labor
- Water, infrastructure
- Public will NIMBY, Antigrowth/density
- But.... permits and new housing back 40K+ since 2018

Demand


- Job growth = workers = people







Change in the School Age Population 2020-2030






Implications From Age and Aging

- Consumer demand
- Labor force
- Fastest Growth 65+, slower growth in younger ages
- Housing household size, mobility, ownership vary by age
 - Retires aging in place and demand from new workers.
- Housing transition older adults aging out
- Millennials aging into prime and second home ownership
- Gen Z aging into housing and first time home buying

If.... Then - Everything Connected


- Aging Fastest growth in the 65+
 - Retirements driving migration
 - Tight labor force can Colorado attract/retain workers?
 - Drives economy health care, leisure and hospitality
 - Move less and smaller household size
- Population growth is slowing but still growing
 - Births have slowed, deaths increase
 - Migration/Mobility slowing, International slowed pre COVID and COVID
- Job growth drives migration -impact from remote and Gig workers
 - Migration Competition, attract, retain
- Housing Aging in place, turnover, new jobs, old jobs, remote jobs, second homes, VRBO/Investors.



Implications - Labor Force

- National competition
- Reimagine Intentional, strategic, creative
- Additive vs. Poached
- Employee centered (first time since 60s)
 - Benefits, Internal training and development
 - Community Services Housing, Day Care
- Increase labor force participation
 - <24 and >55
 - People with Disabilities
 - People of Color higher unemployment and lower labor force participation
 - Formerly incarcerated






